## *Pastor's Letter*

Sabbatical - a familiar word, but I believe a brand new concept for Starmount Presbyterian Church. Sabbatical leave is a practice most strongly associated with academia, but it certainly has roots in the church, in scripture, in the very order of creation itself. In Genesis we hear: "And on the seventh [Sabbath] day God finished the work that he had done, and he rested on the seventh [Sabbath] day from all the work that he had done. So God blessed the seventh [Sabbath] day and hallowed it, because on it God rested from all the work that he had done in creation" (Genesis 2:2-3). The seventh day is a day of rest. It is a day of letting go of our work, our cares, our struggles. It is a day of rejuvenation, restoration and renewal. It is a day to let God form us and change us and renew us through worship, reflection and rest.

The concept of Sabbath rest and renewal is expanded later in the Bible to include a Sabbath (seventh) year in which the land was to remain fallow so that even the land could rest from producing food. Sabbath rest reached its fullest development in the Jubilee Year which was the seventh seven year cycle. During the Jubilee Year, God's people were to reboot their whole society. They were to become a new creation. In addition to all of the prior Sabbath practices, property reverted back to its original owner. All debts were cancelled. Slaves were freed. It was a time for the entire community to begin anew.

Building on the biblical concept of Sabbath, Salem Presbytery has written a Sabbatical leave into the terms of call of all of its pastors for the past decade. In every seventh year of service, a pastor qualifies for a three month sabbatical leave. As of March 1, 2012, I will be entering my seventh year of service and joy as pastor of Starmount. Therefore I am planning my Sabbatical Leave from May 28 – August 25, 2012. This extended time will be qualitatively different from vacation or days off. It is an opportunity for me to strategically disengage from regular and normal tasks so that our ministry and mission together may be viewed from a new perspective because of this planned time of focus. The Session through its Personnel Committee is

working with the staff and me to form the plan. You will be hearing much more about it as the Sabbatical leave draws closer, but at its core it will include time for me to begin my first course work in a Doctor of Ministry program at Columbia Theological Seminary in Decatur, Georgia, and will also afford me the opportunity to church "hop" and experience best practices in other congregations.

This will be a meaningful time of growth for me and for Starmount. Please watch for more information and keep me, the session, and Personnel Committee in your prayers as together we perfect the details of Sabbatical leave plan.

#### **2011 Annual Report**

#### **Purposes:**

- To provide support, encouragement and love to our church family
- To keep in touch through phone calls, card care, and monthly visits with our homebound and those in care facilities
- To maintain relationships with those unable to get out and feel "connected" to our church family
- To make weekly visits to those who are hospitalized and maintain a record of such in the church workroom

#### **Accomplishments:**

- The committee welcomed two new members and assigned visit schedules for home bound and hospital rotations. Patty Ritter has agreed to maintain the card ministry program. We maintain visitations and connections with 29 members who are confined to home or care facilities and an additional 20 members who are becoming less active.
- Sentimental Journey is an annual luncheon honoring our members who are age 80 and over with lunch and a musical program. This event, chaired by Evelyn Nadler and planned & executed by the committee, was held May 15, 2011 with theme " Thanks for the Memories". Several members of our congregation provided musical entertainment and the youth assisted in serving. This undertaking honored 79 members of our congregation and attendance was at an all-time high with over 90 total guests.
- Twice this year, during the Easter and Christmas season, flowers were delivered and communion offered to our home and facility bound members. 35-45 flowers were delivered each season. Communion was administered to those who desired with support from Cynthia Pugh, John Odom, and Elders who are among our committee members. In some cases, Elder support was provided by non-committee members of our congregation and this outreach is encouraged.
- Cynthia Pugh, our Parish Visitor, continues to provide staff support to our committee. This year, as the number of our home and facility bound members increased through the year, she elected to spend her 10 hours a week in total focus of visitation in lieu of attending committee meetings. This decision was supported by pastoral staff and the committee. Cynthia continues to provide monthly reports and is available via phone or email for any concerns that arise. She will be attending meetings again beginning in Jan. 2012. Cynthia provides a vital connection in building a close and loving relationship with those members of our congregation who are unable to join us on a regular basis.
- The email prayer chain via SPC Caring continues with the support of Brenda Triplett and pastoral staff.
- The Baby Banner is maintained by Gwen Ratterree to recognize and celebrate new births and/or adoptions. We recognize both parents and grand parents in this endeavor.
- Several committee members provide transportation to older members of our congregation or those who can no longer drive.

# BUILDING & GROUNDS REPORT

As its name implies, the "Building & Grounds Committee" is responsible for the care and maintenance of Starmount's physical plant. This is no small task for it includes our heating and air conditioning systems, hot water boiler and distribution pumps, air handlers and air filtration, numerous "air to air" units, thermostat maintenance and calibration etc. etc. Our plumbing concerns center on our 17 restrooms and kitchen facilities. Maintenance here is a constant concern as many of our facilities are 50+ years young.

Building & Grounds oversees our security system, fire control and smoke detection and insures regular inspection of these devices. It's our job to monitor utility expenses while insuring that all offices, sanctuary, classrooms and meeting rooms are comfortable year 'round. An upgrade to our sanctuary HVAC control system in 2010 has returned over \$6,500.00 in utility savings in its first year of operation!

It's our committee that attempts to keep rainwater outside and arrange roof and ceiling repairs when that doesn't happen. We also take charge of seeing that our parking lots are as snow-free as possible and that all sidewalks are safe for young and old. We routinely monitor the condition of our parking areas and arrange sealing and/or re-paving as required. We had approximately \$10,000.00 of roofing repairs done in 2011 to stop leaks, but we still have a long way to go to meet all of our roofing needs.

We were able to completely renovate the three restrooms nearest our sanctuary. These upgrades included new fixtures, paint, floor tile, ceiling tile, new partitions, countertops and sinks. We were also able to remove the carpet from our main hallway and extend the same tile that is used in our gathering space.

Our Facilities Manager, Johnny Burris, oversees all custodial efforts and supervises our part-time cleaning staff. He also maintains all consumable cleaning and paper products, arranges rooms as required for meeting groups, and performs most

of our on-site electrical and plumbing repairs. It was Johnny who conceived and implemented the idea of selling pine needles so our youth could raise funds for their mission activities. From this project they generated \$3,500.00.

The cleanliness of our sanctuary, offices, classrooms and restrooms are also the responsibility of this committee. And we haven't even mentioned our exterior grounds where we arrange for weekly mowing, annual fertilization, weed control and shrub mulching. Our Columbarium is also maintained by the Building and Grounds Committee.

It's up to our committee to provide safe, secure storage of all of our church's curriculum materials, historical records, etc. Oh, and don't forget the bi-annual inspection of our elevator! We're actively pursuing the replacement of all incandescent bulbs in our facility as well as the implementation of a recycling program. There's always something to do on Building & Grounds Committee and we welcome your participation. We're always looking for "green thumbs" and those folks willing to chip in and help paint, patch or repair.

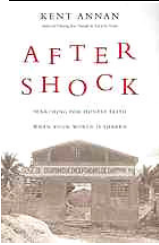

## After Shock, Searching for Honest Faith When Your World is Shaken by Kent Annan.

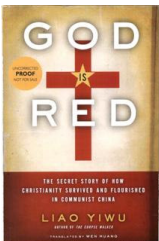

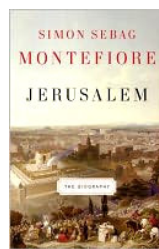
## God is Red, The Secret Story of How Christianity Survived and Flourished in Communist China by Liao YiWu.

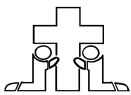
